Dear Parents and Carers,

It is with great pleasure that I write to you as we reach the end of term and the end of the academic year.

The children enjoyed their transition days last week and extensive efforts were taken to help the children discover and experience their new classroom and work with their adults. The school was a hive of activity and excitement as children prepared work for their new classroom. Many parents were able to meet their child's new teacher on collection and we hope that the change to classroom doors and zones is also clearer for families too.

A highlight this term has been our Year 6 performance of Mary Poppins. The Year 5 and 6 classes performed incredibly well under extreme heat conditions. All children have coped well with the heatwaves this term. Their resilience was tested but they continued to try their best and adapted to being inside all day. Whilst adaptations were made, we managed to continue some learning too.

Annual reports have been distributed and myself, Miss Morrison and Mr Nyczka enjoyed reading them. Our children have made some big strides in their progress of reading and maths. Writing has been taught differently this year through the use of a new whole school and trust wide scheme. The children are enjoying the new way of working and thinking with their teachers using their key texts. We are beginning to see the positive impact of this and look forward to embedding this next year.

We have been very fortunate that Mrs Bellett, the school's new Principal, has been in to school many times and she has a good understanding of school routines, key people and the school's vision and values. As with all schools, there are always areas to work on, and she has worked with myself, the senior leadership team and staff to plan the next steps and strategic vision for the school moving forward. I am confident that the school will continue being the best it can be for all its children and staff.

Thank you so much for the support you have given to the school during my 5 years of headship here at OPS. It has been a pleasure and privilege to have fulfilled this role and take the school on its next chapter. We achieved an 'excellent' SIAMS outcome and a 'good' grading from Ofsted. We have a Healthy Schools Award, two Eco Green Flags and have recently achieved the PE Gold Sports Mark Award. Our school continues to collaborate with its local community including St Peter's Church in a wide range of activities and events and long may this continue to enrich our children's life experiences. OPS will have a special place in my heart.

On behalf of the staff, we would like to say thank you for all your support this year. Thank you for your kind gifts and cards. We wish everyone a wonderful Summer holiday.

As the cost of living continues to increase Oundle Foodbank has received funding from Trussell to provide income maximisation advice via North Northants Citizens Advice. We have a dedicated fully trained advisor who is available to give advice and help to people in the local area.

Eco- Council

We are delighted to share that our school has been awarded the Eco-Schools Award! This fantastic achievement reflects the hard work and commitment of our pupils and staff throughout the year.

Our Eco Team met regularly to discuss environmental issues and decide on key areas to focus on. We chose biodiversity, litter, and water as our priorities. Although we are lucky to live in a biodiverse area, we recognised that we could do more to support and protect it. To help, we created biodegradable bird feeders, which we regularly top up, and planted bee-friendly seeds to encourage more insects to our school grounds.

To tackle litter, we organised several litter picks and introduced a new, easier recycling and composting system. We designed clear labels with pictures so everyone knows exactly where their waste should go.

For water conservation, we encouraged all children to turn taps off properly and created posters to remind everyone. We also collected rainwater in buckets to help refill our pond.

In June, we celebrated our efforts with a whole-school Eco Day, where pupils took part in a range of exciting eco-friendly activities. Throughout the year, assemblies have also helped keep everyone informed and involved in our journey.

We are incredibly proud of what we have achieved together and look forward to continuing our eco-friendly work!

Did you know about the Great British Summer Savings?

Please find below a message from the Secretary of State



Rising prices can make life's little treats harder to afford, especially during the school holidays when costs build up for families. This Government is determined to help, and that is why last month the Chancellor announced the *Great British Summer Savings* scheme.

From 25 June to 1 September 2026, the Government is temporarily cutting VAT from 20% to 5% on children's meals in restaurants, children and family tickets to cinemas, theatres, concerts and exhibitions, and admission to a wide range of attractions. Combined with free bus travel during August for children aged 5 to 15 in England, families and young people will be able to enjoy experiences that make summer special, including visits to the kinds of cultural and educational attractions that enrich children's lives outside the classroom.

Pre-School News!

This term we have been travelling all 'Around the World'. The children have learnt about different animals, including sea animals and animals that are native to Africa. We painted lions faces and used our scissors skills to cut the lions mane- they looked very fierce! Jus like our story, Handa's Surprise, we have explored different fruits such as mango, avocado, passionfruit and pineapple and enjoyed tasting them. At Forest school we made African bracelets by cutting elder wood, using a stick to push the middle out and then threading a pipe cleaner on to it. The children have also explored musical instruments and spent time creating their own music.

To end the year on a high, we were very excited to go on our trip to Barnwell Country Park where the children learnt about the animals and insects that live there. They were great ambassadors for the school and were eager to tell others about their visit when they returned.

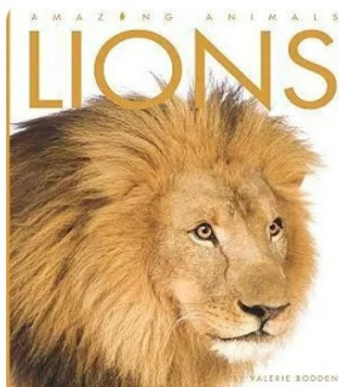
We are so proud of everything the children have accomplished this year. They have grown in confidence, developed new skills and created wonderful friendships. Thank you for all of your support throughout the year.

Year 1 News!



In Writing lessons this term, we have enjoyed listening to non-fiction books such as 'Lions' by Valerie Booden. We have found out lots of facts about this animal. We have written facts using 'and' in a list and adjectives to describe the lion.

Here are some of the sentences we wrote...

'Lions can be eight feet long.'

'Lions are carnivores and they hunt for food such as zebras.'

'Female lions go hunting at night and eat wildebeasts.'

'Lions and cubs stay in a group called a pride.'

'Mother lions teach their cubs to find food and to hunt.'

In Maths lessons, we have been learning about time and have been able to order our daily routine during the school day. We have also used our geometry skills to understand the position of different objects using language such as left, right, below and above.

In our Art lessons we have really liked learning about natural art. We have studied the artist Andy Goldsworthy and have discussed his beautiful sculptures using natural objects such as leaves, pebbles, natural paints and chalks.

We enjoyed making our own natural paintbrushes and explored how to create texture by using leaves to brush across the paper, mini pinecones (which we rolled and dotted paint on with), feathers for light brush effects and other natural objects. Look at our amazing natural paint brushes and paintings!

To end a lovely year, we had an amazing trip to Hamerton Zoo! We enjoyed listening to zoo keeper Phoebe, and learnt lots of information about animals with fur, feathers and scales. We topped it off with a picnic under the shelter. What fun!

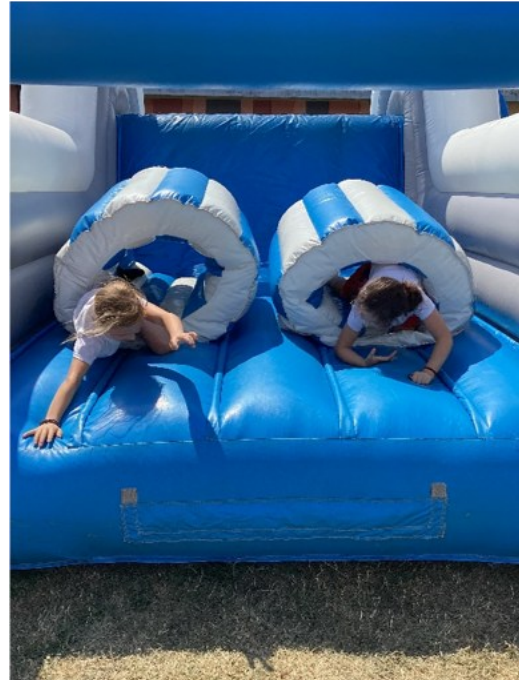

Year 2/3 News!

Last week the children were fortunate enough to have a go on a variety of inflatables. This treat was welcomed by the whole Year group. They enjoyed running around, racing and kicking balls up to the target. It encouraged teamwork, friendships and allowed the children time to have fun with their peers.



This term in Forest School, the children brought their volcano topic to life by creating their own exciting volcanic eruptions! Using red-dyed water and bicarbonate of soda, they explored how chemical reactions can create spectacular "explosions" while linking their learning to their classroom topic.

The children also developed their outdoor skills by learning how to use flint and steel to light fires safely. In the mud kitchen, they enjoyed imaginative play with "lava" water, inspired by their volcano learning.

As part of their Science work, the children investigated friction by testing cars and trucks on ramps with different materials at the bottom. They made predictions about which surfaces would slow the vehicles down the most and compared their results, developing their scientific thinking and enquiry skills.

Alongside these focused activities, the children continued to enjoy all the favourite Forest School experiences, including swinging, tree climbing, bug hunting, and exploring the natural environment. It has been a fantastic term full of curiosity, adventure, and hands-on learning!

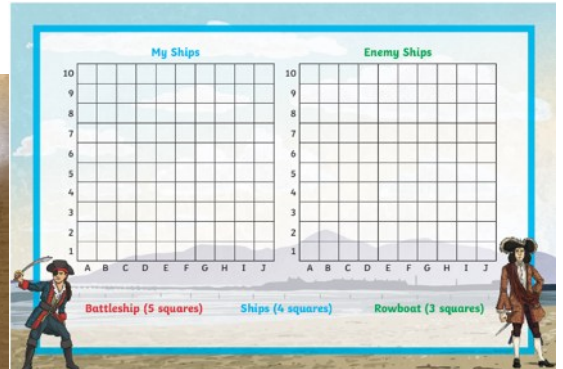
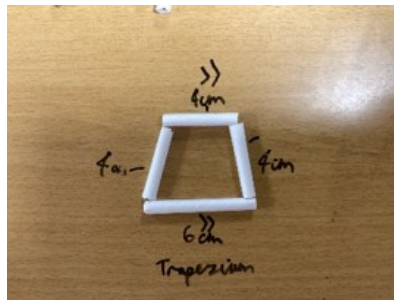
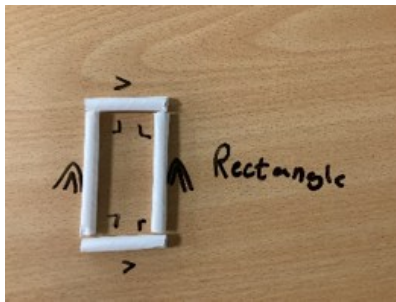


Year 4 News!

Maths

Year 4 have had a fantastic time exploring the world of quadrilaterals! The children learnt that all quadrilaterals are closed, 2D shapes with four sides and four vertices before investigating the different types, including rectangles, squares, parallelograms, rhombuses and trapeziums. They enjoyed getting hands-on by creating their own quadrilaterals using straws and labelling each shape according to its properties. One of the highlights was drawing directly onto the tables to explore and compare different shapes – something the children absolutely loved!

Another unit the children enjoyed was how to plot and read coordinates on a grid, remembering to read the x-axis first and then the y-axis. They put their new knowledge into practice by playing Battleships, using coordinates to find each other's ships. It was a fantastic way to build confidence while having lots of fun!



Swimming

Throughout the Summer Term, Year 4 have thoroughly enjoyed their weekly swimming lessons. They have developed their confidence in the water while practising a range of swimming strokes, including breaststroke, front crawl and backstroke. The children also enjoyed diving down to collect sinkers from the bottom of the pool, putting their growing confidence into practice. The children have also worked hard to improve a variety of water skills and should be very proud of the progress they have made.

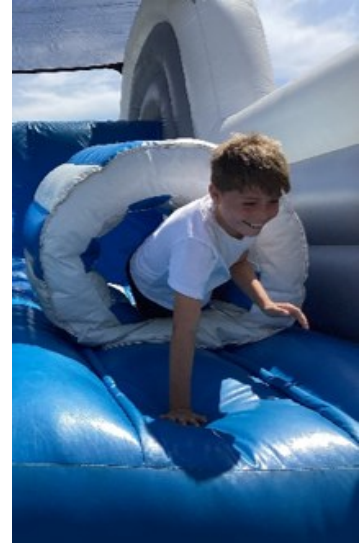
During their final swimming sessions, the children focused on water safety and survival skills. They learnt about life-saving strokes, how to call for help in an emergency and the meaning of different beach safety flags. Some children even came to their lesson wearing their pyjamas to experience what it feels like to swim while wearing clothes, helping them to understand the importance of staying calm and making safe choices around water.



Year 4 News!

Inflatables

Year 4 had an exciting opportunity to enjoy a range of inflatable activities! The children had great fun tackling the assault course, testing their aim at the football dartboard and challenging each other in the gladiator ring. There were lots of smiles, laughter and friendly competition as they raced against one another and cheered on their classmates. It was a wonderful opportunity for the children to spend time with their friends, build their teamwork and resilience and enjoy a fun-filled experience that was a little different from their usual school day.



French

This term in French, the children have been learning the names of a variety of foods in French and have enjoyed expanding their vocabulary through fun and practical activities. As part of their learning, they created their own French menus, using the new words they had learnt with growing confidence.

To round off the term, the children were delighted to sample a selection of traditional French foods, including crêpes, croissants, baguettes and pains au chocolat. It was a fantastic way to bring their learning to life and the children thoroughly enjoyed tasting these delicious treats while celebrating all they had learnt in French this term!

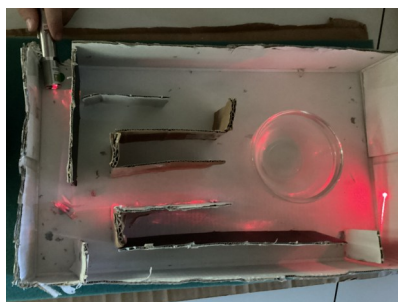
Year 5 News!

Visit to the SciTech Building – A Day of Discovery at the STEM Festival

Year 5 recently enjoyed an unforgettable visit to the SciTech building at Oundle School as part of the annual STEM Festival. The day was filled with exciting, hands-on activities designed to inspire curiosity and develop our understanding of science, technology, engineering, and maths.

Upon arrival, we were welcomed and quickly organised into small groups, ready to take on a carousel of different challenges throughout the day. Each activity gave us the opportunity to explore a different area of STEM in a fun and interactive way.

Our first challenge was the *laser maze*. In this activity, we had to direct a laser beam from one point to another using only mirrors, carefully avoiding various obstacles along the way. It required teamwork, problem-solving, and patience as we adjusted the angles of the mirrors to guide the beam correctly. Through this, we learned how light travels in straight lines and reflects off surfaces, helping us to better understand key scientific concepts.



Next, we took part in a robotics session where we programmed small robotic cars. By inputting a sequence of precise instructions, we controlled how the cars moved around a track. This activity showed us just how important accuracy is when coding—one small error could completely change the robot's path! It was fascinating to see our commands come to life and helped us appreciate the logic behind computer programming.

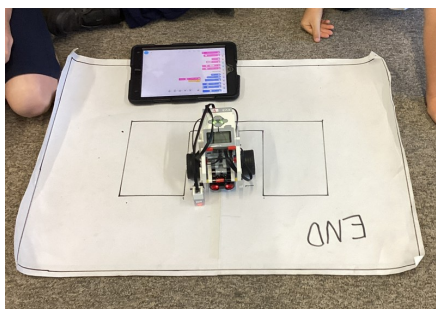
We then visited the planetarium, which was a truly awe-inspiring experience. Inside, we learned about the origins of space and the formation of stars and planets. We also explored different constellations, discovering how they got their names and the stories behind them. It was amazing to see the night sky projected above us and to deepen our understanding of the universe.

Another highlight of the day was working with Bunsen burners in a chemistry session. We tested different elements by heating them and observing the colours of the flames they produced. This experiment introduced us to the periodic table and helped us understand how scientists can identify elements using flame tests. It was exciting to work in a real lab environment and experience practical science first-hand.

To finish the day, we became engineers by designing and building our own catapults using lolly sticks and elastic bands. After constructing our catapults, we tested them by launching pom-poms and measuring how far they travelled. We were then challenged to improve our designs, thinking carefully about what changes might make them more effective. This activity encouraged creativity, teamwork, and resilience as we refined our ideas.



Throughout the day, Year 5 demonstrated excellent behaviour, enthusiasm, and a willingness to try new things. It was a fantastic opportunity to learn outside the classroom, and everyone came away inspired by the possibilities within STEM subjects.



We would like to thank Oundle School for hosting such a brilliant event and giving us the chance to take part in such a memorable experience. Year 5 returned to school full of excitement, new knowledge, and a greater interest in the world of science and technology.
